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Foynes Port

Second largest Port in Ireland after Dublin (by tonnage)

One of only 3 Tier 1 ports in Ireland

Only port in Ireland with deep water access in excess of 20 metres

Only Irish port capable of accommodating Panamax and Post Panamax vessels

Accommodates vessels up to 40,000 dead weight tonnes (dwt) and 200+ metres in length

N69 National Primary Road - joins the Motorway network at Limerick (40km)

Rail line directly from Foynes Port to Limerick City (discontinued in 2000, plans to re-open)

Foynes Port is operated by Shannon Foynes Port Company www.sfpc.ie

Limerick

Foynes is 37km from Limerick City

Limerick is Ireland's third largest City with a population of 100,000 people

460,000 people within a 60km radius

Multinational companies in Limerick include Intel, GE Capital, Shannon Aerospace and Lufthansa Technik

The designation is primarily to cater for port industries which are heavy industries by nature.

There is an Enclosure on part of the site which is detailed on the Record of Monuments and Places (LI001-099).

The site bounds the Robertstown River which is within a Special Protection Area (SPA), a Special Area of Conservation (SAC) and a Proposed Natural Heritage Area. These designations are prevalent along the Lower Shannon Estuary.


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
